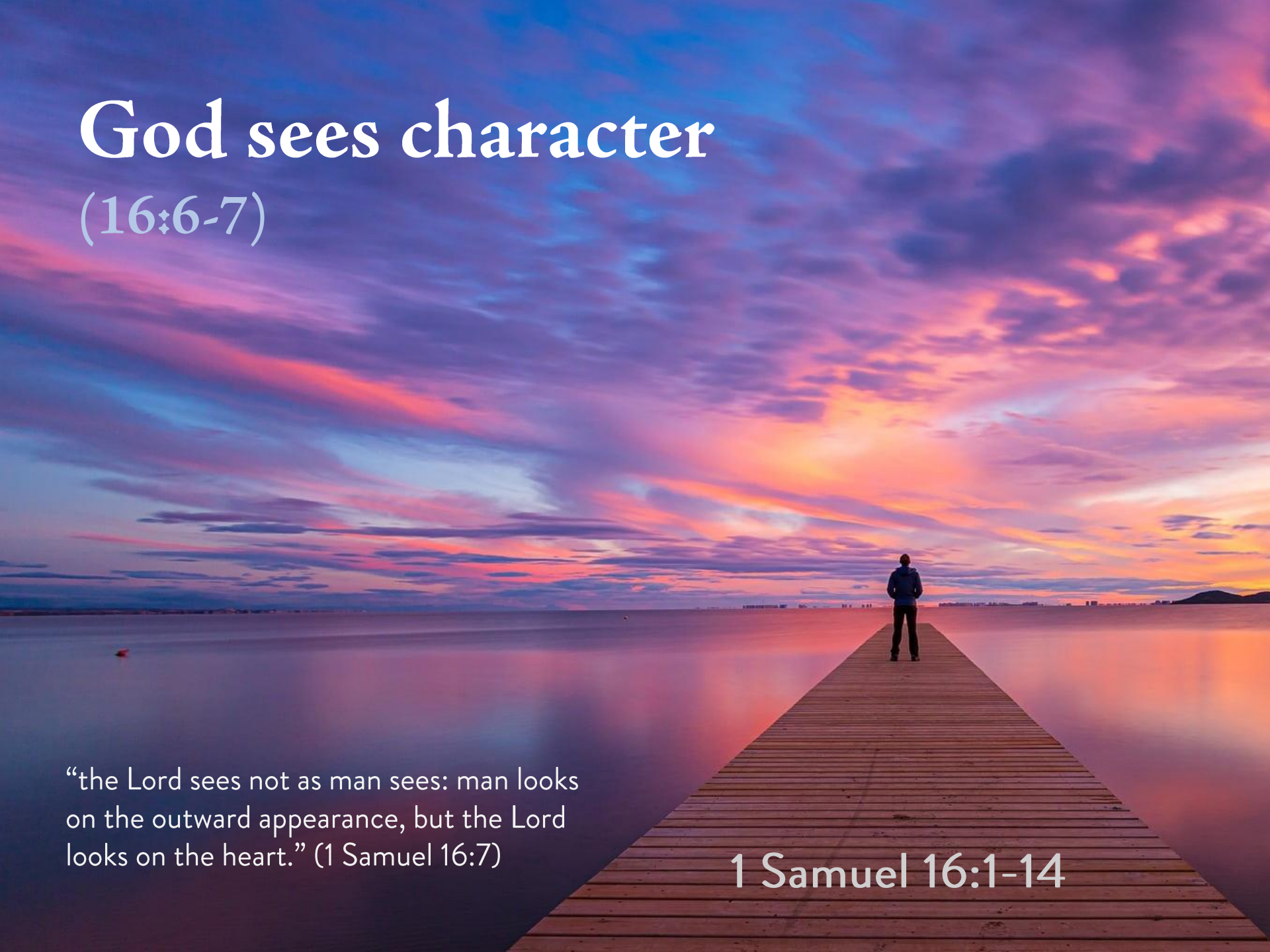


# God sees character

# How do we see Jesus?


“He had no beauty or majesty that made us notice Him” (Isa. 53:2)
